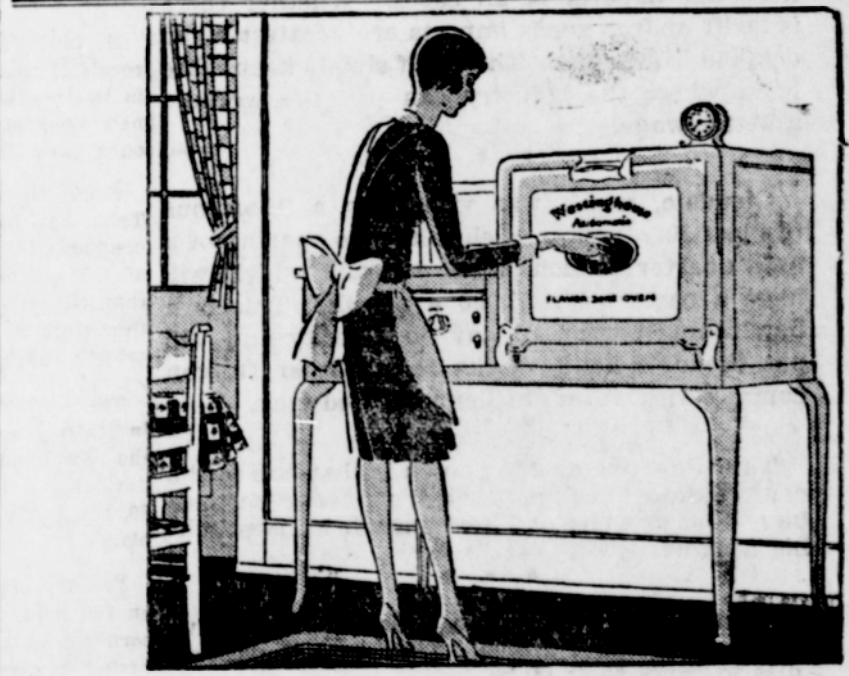
Two Fined for Speeding
