The three Springfield post office clerks rated high in the regular annual case examination which was held in the local chamber of commerce rooms Monday forenoon by W. IN THE CIRCUIT COURT OF THE C. Ott, chief clerk at large from the STATE OF OREGON, IN AND FOR division headquarters at Seattle.

The examination consisted of distributing 828 post cards into 53 different bunches in the minimum amount of time. Mrs. F. B. Hamlin, wife of the postmaster, received the highest in the examination. Of the 828 cards she distributed 827 of them correctly for a percentage of 99.87, taking 22 minutes for the work.

W. N. Gossler distributed five of the cards incorrectly for a percentage of 99.39, taking 23 minutes. L. A. Nice spent 28 minutes at work and made nine errors for a percentage of 98.91


