**MR. AND MRS. PETERSON REACH TOP OF MT. HOOD WITH LEGION CLIMBERS**  
City Recorder and Mrs. L. M. Peterson returned Monday night from the Hood River vicinity where they spent the week-end on the annual climb of Mt. Hood sponsored by the Oregon American Legion. The climb up the mountain from the American Legion camp on Tillyjane creek was made Sunday by approximately 200 people, one-third of whom were women.

The party camped on Tillyjane creek, as far up the peak as autos can travel, Saturday night. They broke camp and started up the mountain at 4:30 o'clock Sunday morning. The climb is steep and quite tiring. Mr. Peterson said, but not overly difficult or dangerous. The route led around all the glaciers, which are quite dangerous for travel at this time of the year. Members of the Crag Rats Hood River mountain-climbing organization, acted as guides.

By traveling in easy stretches and stopping frequently to rest, the party of mountain-climbers reached the top of the peak, five miles from their starting place at 12:30. The last mile of the route led through the snow fields. The peak of Mt. Hood was covered with clouds Sunday. Mr. Peterson said, so it was impossible to get a view of the surrounding country such as is obtainable when the air is clear. After spending a short time on the summit, the party returned down the mountain, reaching the Legion camp about 5:30 in the evening.
