SPRINGFIELD GIRLS BACK FROM CRATER AFTER SEASON THERE

Iowa Carlton and Elizabeth Hughes, Springfield girls, returned Thursday from Crater Lake National Park where they have been spending the summer as employees at the Crater Lake Lodge. Myrtle Harvey, also of Springfield, will remain at the Lodge until September 20. Maurine Lombard, Beth Johns, and Gladys Walker returned from the lake in July, after spending a month there.
The girls had a very enjoyable summer at Crater Lake, according to Miss Hughes. The weather was very cool and pleasant there throughout most of the summer, in fact, in the early weeks of July and now, near the close of the season, the nights are cold enough to be uncomfortable. There were 50 employed at the Lodge.
This was a record-breaking year for attendance at Crater Lake, Miss Hughes said. It is not known as yet how many people were there, but the number is believed to exceed last year's total by several thousand. There were persons from every state in the union and almost every nation of the globe registered at the Crater Lake Lodge during the summer. Among the most famous who stopped there was Greta Garbo, famed motion picture actress, and Dr. Ray Lyman Wilbur, secretary of the Interior in President Hoover's cabinet.
A number of improvements were made at the lake this season, Miss Hughes reports. A new porch was added to the Lodge, and a new trail was built from the edge of the lake down to the water. The park closes to the public September 20. There will probably be snow on the rim by then, as park officials were expecting it soon at the time the local girls left. Last year the first snow came earlier than this.
This was the second season at the Lake for Miss Hughes and Miss Carlton.

POWER CO. IS TROUBLED BY FIRES NEAR LINES

The service men of the local Mountain States Power company have been having considerable difficulty during the past several days on account of forest fires which are burning along their lines in several parts of the county. Friday two burned trees fell across the wires two miles west of Elmira, and service to the residences in that district was suspended for 40 minutes. The Snellson Brothers saw mill near Elmira was stopped for over three hours on account of the accident.
Saturday night a burned tree fell across the power line near Jasper, stopping service in that vicinity for 40 minutes. Friday afternoon a radio pole falling across the wires at the Tomseth resident near the reservoir hill caused several short circuits and disrupted things in general for a while. The company officials are anxiously watching other fires near their lines and are ready for further trouble.

COUNTY CHAMBER MEETS WEDNESDAY AT GROVE

The Lane county chamber of commerce will hold its annual meeting at Cottage Grove next Wednesday evening, September 18, according to word received by Walter Gossler, secretary of the local chamber, from T. J. Filippin, secretary of the county body. The principal speaker of the evening will be Leonard E. Read, of Portland, assistant manager of the Western division of the United States chamber of commerce. A number of problems of general interest to Lane county probably will be discussed at that time. The official delegates from Springfield to the chamber meeting are W. A. Taylor, J. A. S'avey, and W. K. Barnell, but any other member of the local chamber of commerce who wish to attend may do so.
