450 TONS ICE WASTED IN FAULTY REFRIGERATION

Springfield poured 450 tons of melted ice down the drain pipes of its refrigerators during the last year without its housewives getting any good from it.

This amazing figure, arrived at by the Leonard Institute of Food Preservation, is the annual ice waste in Springfield due to faulty refrigeration. It is based on a survey of ice meltage in Rochester, New York, showing a per capita waste of 500 pounds of ice. The American public is literally pouring water into a sieve, the water being in the form of ice and the sieve being the leaky uninsulated refrigerator that does not keep out hot air.

The average family should use about 8,000 pounds of ice a year if the refrigerator is well insulated and the doors fit tightly, according to food specialists. This provides for keeping the ice chamber well filled in winter as well as summer. Although the average family only used half this amount, the survey at Rochester, a typical American city, showed that an alarming portion of the ice purchased is wasted each year in the average home. For the nation this involves a loss of millions in ice alone, besides the even greater loss in spoiled food.

PORTLAND MAN HAS DEER DRESSED HERE

Ora Neet of Portland brought a two point buck into the Swarts Meat market early Monday morning to be dressed. The deer weighed 160 pounds when dressed, skinned and quartered.

The party of Portland men with Mr. Neet were successful in bagging four deer over the week-end, and they were the first persons to have one dressed at a local market.

Wilbur Lloyd is reported to have been the first local citizen to succeed in killing a deer this season. He brought in two the latter part of last week.

Several other Springfield hunters are now in the field seeking their quota of deer. Those who have returned reported that the woods are too dry for successful hunting. Local sportsmen, hunters and fishermen are anxiously awaiting a good rain, which they say will make both hunting and fishing much better than it has been so far this season. The danger of fatal accidents has been materially increased right now with the great influx of somewhat inexperienced hunters, and the more experienced men are hesitant about entering the woods.

Monday Guard Drill Omitted

There were no regular drill sessions of the local unit of the National Guard on Monday night. It was too close to the end of the month declared Lieutenant Swarts, in commenting on the omission. He explained that the local organization had been drilling two nights a week to make up for the drill periods lost during the summer months. There are still two periods to make up in October and then the unit will go back to its regular schedule of drill only on Thursday nights.

Dusts Orange Trees in California

DeForest Joralmon returned to Springfield Friday morning after an absence of two months. Mr. Joralmon usually spends two months of each year in Orange county, California, where he spends his time dusting the orange trees with cyanide was. He was gassed in the late war and the existence of gas in his system enables him to do this work without any further injury to himself.

New Grain Corporation

Chicago, Oct. 3 (Autocaster)—A meeting in Chicago is to complete the organization of the \$20,000,000 Farmers' National Grain Marketing Corporation, by which means the cooperative grain marketing associations of the United States expect to obtain financial aid from the Federal Farm Board. When the committee of sixteen grain marketing leaders meets it will be called as a Board of Directors of the new corporation. Immediately a gigantic marketing program will be launched and agencies will be started in grain centers of this and in countries, such as has been done by the Canadian wheat farmers.
