

**GAS CO. MAKES RAPID GROWTH IN TWENTY YEARS**

The development of a small gas company with a single pipe line 100 miles long from Petrolia, Texas, to Fort Worth in 1910, to a system which ranks today among the greatest with a network of pipe lines more than 3500 miles long, drawing gas from 21 gas fields and from more than 1000 wells, is the story of the development of the Lone Star Gas Corporation, which last week announced its purchase of the Northwest Cities Gas company, of which the Eugene and Springfield company is a member.

The Lone Star Gas company, which is a pipe line company operating in Southern Oklahoma and in Northern Texas, is now supplying natural gas at wholesale rates to more than 275 towns in these two states. In addition to this pipe line system, the corporation owns and operates the Community Natural Gas corporation, which has distributing plants in 240 Texas and Oklahoma towns, the Fort Worth Gas company, the Dallas Gas company, the County Gas company, the Northwest Cities Gas company, the Texas Cities Gas company and several others. The recent purchase in the Pacific Northwest brings the total number of customers up to 270,000.

During the past summer the Lone Star Gas company has made improvements which have cost them several million dollars. Fifty new town plants were built and added to the system, several new buildings have been erected and more than 300 miles of line have been constructed. The purchase of the plant here will not bring any changes in the personnel of the local staff, according to an announcement made this week by the purchasers.

**CHURCH CHOR BEGINS CHRISTMAS CANTATA**

The choir of the Christian church began practice on their Christmas cantata this week. They have selected "His Natal Day" by Edward Norman, as their cantata this year. The date upon which it will be given has not been decided yet.

The choir is being directed by Veltie Pruitt, the preacher of the church, who is also director of music at the Eugene Bible university at Eugene. There are seats for thirty-one persons in the choir loft now, and indications are that it may be necessary to enlarge this to accommodate all of the singers.
