ALBANY YOUTH ADMITS KILLING MRS. RAMSEY

A sixteen year old boy, Jimmie Ralston, of Albany, admitted Saturday that he was the person who had stolen his father's car from the garage and had run into and killed Mrs. Annie L. Ramsey, 64, on the Pacific highway just east of the city limits on Friday evening.

Young Ralston in his confession stated that he had taken the car out to the airport and was returning to the city at between forty and forty-five miles per hour when he saw the elderly lady stop in the middle of the pavement. He declared that he turned the car to the left and tried to pass her, but that she stepped forward and was hit.

He became frightened and did not stop, but instead drove the machine to the old Albany-Lebanon road, where he abandoned it and went to his home. With the car missing the boy's father notified the police that his automobile had been stolen, his son claiming that he had not seen the machine and making no statement regarding the accident to his parents.

Mrs. Ramsey is a former resident of this locality. She lived east of Springfield for many years before moving to Albany about five years ago.

CHRISTMAS MAILING INSTRUCTIONS GIVEN

Now that the Christmas season is almost with us again, the matter of handling the millions of packages and greeting cards which usually flood the post office system of this country at this season, has prompted the early distribution of instructions regarding the proper manner in which to pack and ship Christmas gifts.

A quantity of these circulars have been received by F. B. Hamlin, the local post master, who has already posted them in the more conspicuous places of the city.

Closed Christmas Day

Attention is called, first of all, to the fact that the post office will be closed on Christmas day and that any packages which are not mailed early enough will not be received until after Christmas. Also to the fact that the large volume of mail increases the possibility of having packages lost in the mails and that to insure the safe delivery of valuable gifts they should be insured by the sender.

It seems needless to remind the public to wrap their packages securely. Employees of the post office are very busy during the month of December, and do not have much time to re-tie or wrap parcels which have been opened, or to examine packages on which the addresses are not written clearly, so it is to the senders' advantage to be careful.

The following schedule for mailing has been issued this year. Christmas cards and gifts addressed to points within one day's travel should be mailed in no event later than December 20; within two days' travel, not later than December 18; within three days travel, not later than December 16; for points more distant not later than December 14.

WOODEN BLOCK FROM CAPITOL IS RECEIVED

A block of wood from the trusses which were removed from the roof of the White House at the time it was remodeled two years ago, has been received here by Laurence Moffitt, principal of the Lincoln school. It will be placed on display in the school where everyone may see it.

The souvenir was sent by the National Lumber Manufacturers' Association at Washington, D. C. This organization received several of the trusses when they were removed from the White House, and have cut them into blocks which they are distributing among the several schools and historical societies in the United States.

One of the whole trusses is now stored in the warehouse of the Office of Public Buildings and Public Parks in Washington. It will be put on exhibition along with the other historical relics as soon as room can be found for it.

The trusses were placed in the White House 112 years ago, at the time that the British fired the building, forcing President Madison and his wife Dolly to flee.
