Principal Events of the Week Assembled for Information of Our Readers.

After a brief filmess Donald Me Leod, master of the largest flock of sheep in Malheur county, died last week. He was a bachelor.

The first two carloads of Jerusalem artichoke tubers to be shipped out of Linn county have been forwarded by Schuler Bros. from Crabtree to Santa Rosa, Cal.

Testing for infectious abortion is taking great strides in Polk county. Five communities are now working together to have the test applied to their herds.

The city of Jacksonville has filed with the county court the list of lands owned by the county that it desires as a watershed for its contemplated water system.

Nwberry crater in the Paulina moun tains south of Bend will be partly circled by a rim road, according to plans announced by the Deschutes national forest officials.

The 1928 tax rolls of Polk county turned over to Sheriff Hooker for collection in 1929 show a delinquency of slightly over 10 per cent. This is

State and county taxes in Umatilla county will be six-tenths of a mill less next year than this year even if the voters authorize the creation of &

E. T. Holbrook, predatory animal hunter for Deschutes county, says he has caught 125 coyotes in traps since May and fully as many more have been poisoned in the same time.

Eight Eugene city employes will be discharged January 1, it was announced by Mayor Wilder. The city will save \$10,000 a year by this reduction in the force of employes.

Pursuant to its annual custom the United States reclamation service loaned one of its large trucks at Klamath Falls to the postoffice to be used in delivering holiday parcels.

Two crews of surveyors are working on the Oregon Coast highway between Port Orford and Denmark pre-32 feet, after which it will be graveled and oiled.

Radio station KORE of Eugene. which has been off the air for two weeks, will soon resume broadcasting. It was closed down because of failure of a permit to change location in Eu-

J. W. Barney, who has been roadmaster for Columbia county for the past two years, has resigned to accept a similar position with Washington county. His resignation is effective January 1.

Klamath County Pomona Grange council has lodged a protest with the county court against the budget for 1930. Objection is made to having the state tax commission assisting in fixing valuations.

Members of The Dalles police force will soon appear in new standard uniforms. Because of the increasing number of strangers on the streets of the city a uniformed officer is considered necessary.

Farmers of Linn county, who were recently predicting dire disaster as the result of the unusual dry spell, are now becoming optimistic on account of the heavy rainfall. Grain is in no way damaged.

Twenty-six persons were killed and 406 injured in 2888 traffic accidents in Oregon during November, according to a report prepared by the state motor vehicle department. A total of 1450 accidents were due to reckless driving, while 161 accidents were caused by drivers failing to give proper signals. In 445 accidents the drivers did not give right of way.
