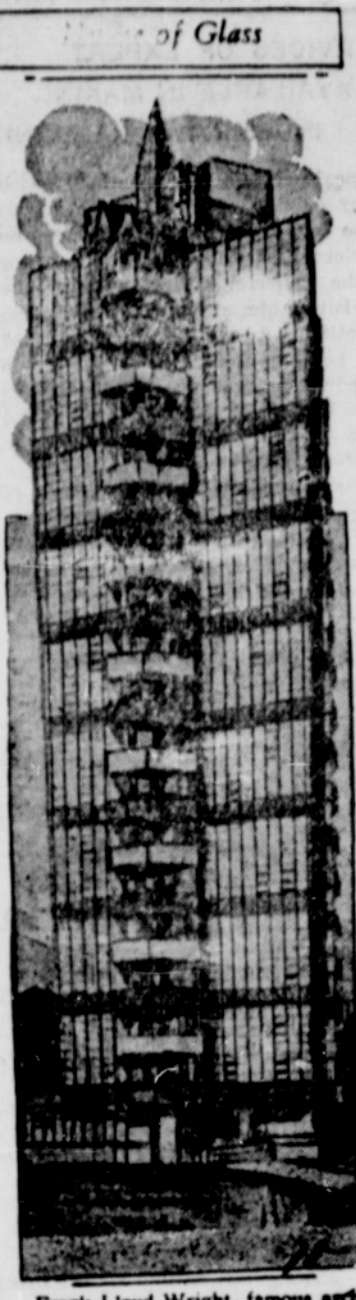

LANE COUNTY PIONEER BURIED HERE MONDAY

William Henry Walker, 82 passed away at the Pacific Christian hospital in Eugene last Friday after a short illness. He had made his home at Jasper for many years.

Mr. Walker was the son of Andrew Magill and Mara Walker. He was born in Albia, Iowa on December 26, 1847. He crossed the plains with his parents in 1852 and they settled on a farm near Albany. He married Parthena Elizabeth Drury in 1874 and has been a resident of Lane county since that time.

He is survived by three sons, Earnest and Grover Walker of Fall Creek, and Lawrence Walker of Jasper; two daughters, Miss Cora Walker of Jasper and Mrs. Ira Hyland of Fall Creek; five grandchildren, and one sister, Mrs. Viola Drury of Fall Creek.

The funeral services were held on Monday morning at 10:00 o'clock from the Walker-Poole funeral home in this city. Rev. C. J. Pike of the Methodist church officiated and interment was made in the Pleasant Hill cemetery.

All physical inspection records of the Crawford public schools have been destroyed by mice, according to a letter received at the offices of Mrs. Mary Fulkerson, county school superintendent at Salem. "It's a tough winter on mice, but a tougher winter on school records," wrote Mrs. Fulkerson's informant.

The business of gathering and selling stray horses is a good one to keep out of, declared Sheriff McCauley of Deschutes county at Bend recently. Sale of nine stray horses resulted in a net loss of \$46 to the county. Thirty horses were rounded up at a cost of \$2 a head. All but nine were claimed, and these were sold for a total of \$14.

The lowly and timid rabbit mother will defend her young. This was proved at Rev. J. E. Snyder's ranch on Coos river recently when Rev. Mr. Snyder found his Chinchilla mother rabbit excited in the morning when he went to feed her. A prairie owl which had sought to carry away some of the little rabbits lay dead in the pen.

Bids have been advertised for the construction of two diversion tunnels on the Owyhee irrigation project. Bids will be opened at the Owyhee irrigation district office in Nyssa March 11. The tunnels, one 6 1/2 miles long, the other 3 1/2 miles in length, with several miles of canal, will cost approximately \$4,000,000, almost as much as the Owyhee dam, it is estimated.

The story of how a mare battled a cougar recently in the Fort Rock country while protecting her colt was related recently by Lee Wright of Eugene, veteran woods worker. The mare fought the big cat by rearing on her hind feet and striking out with her forelegs. While its mother fought the cat the colt raced to the shelter of tents where forest service employes were sleeping.

Linn county has built 38 new bridges, whose total length is 1610 feet, according to the annual report of County Engineer C. H. Leonard. The cost was \$12,314.13. Repairs to 66 old bridges cost \$15,129.74. Twelve new market road bridges, also built during 1929, cost \$16,080.62, and measured 1277 feet in total length. This brought Linn county's total expenditures for bridges in 1929 to \$44,584.22.

The tale of a shooting fray in which eight shots were exchanged and ended in the death of Owen Miller, 21, was told to a coroner's jury at Klamath Falls by C. S. Pope, town marshal of Bonanza. According to witnesses, Miller had sworn to kill Pope because the officer arrested him for disturbing the peace. He walked into a restaurant and started firing at Pope. The officer barely was missed by two bullets.

A total of 32,504 Oregon veterans of the World war and the Spanish American war have availed themselves of the privileges of the state bonus law to date, according to Frank W. Moore, secretary to the Oregon War Veterans' State Aid commission. Of this number 11,636 have taken advantage of the loan provision of the law to borrow sums aggregating \$27,888,825, while 20,868 veterans have claimed their cash bonuses aggregating \$4,623,435. All told, 22,576 veterans have taken the cash bonus, but 2008 of these later changed their minds, refunded the cash payments aggregating \$428,160 and took a bonus loan.
