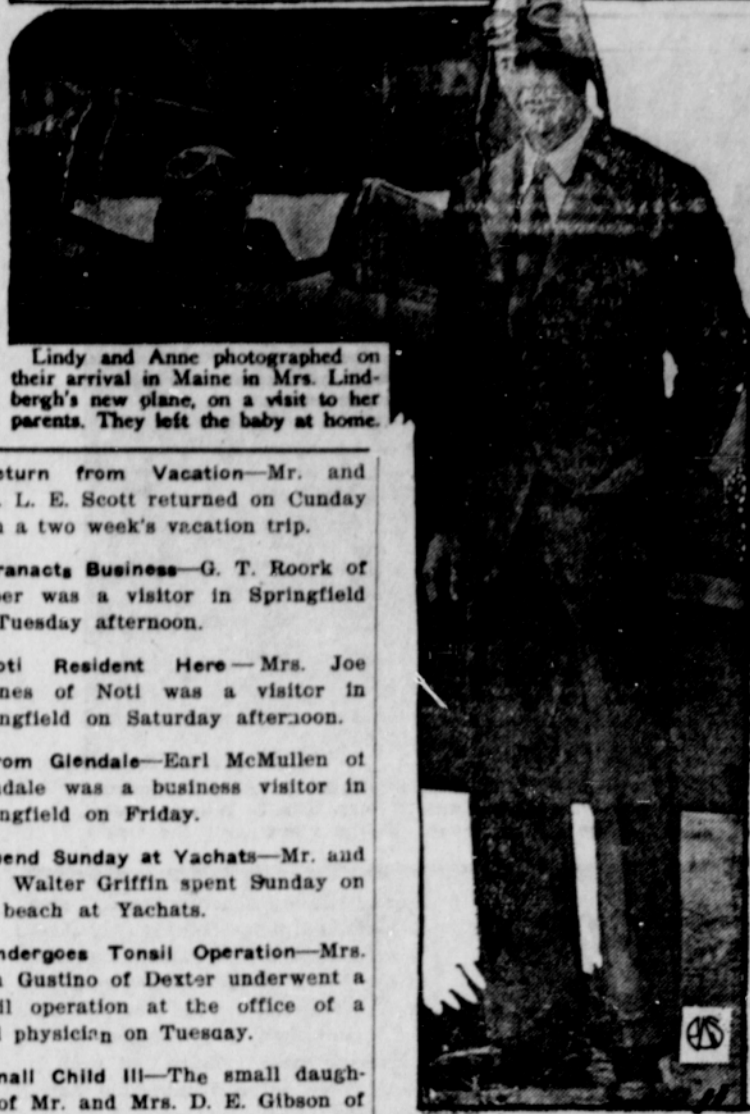

**N. W. SAWMILLS ONLY AT 40% CAPACITY**

SEATTLE, Wash., Sept. 4.—Continuing on the low production schedule they have followed since late in May, a group of 350 mills reporting to the West Coast Lumbermen's association for the week ending August 23 operated at 46.77 per cent of capacity. This figure compares with 47.21 per cent of capacity for the preceding week and with an average of 63 per cent of capacity from January 1 to June 1. These 350 mills have reduced output during the past thirteen weeks by 582,296,000 feet, which represents more than four weeks production for practically the entire lumber industry of Washington, Oregon and British Columbia at present operating schedules.

Orders received by a group of 228 mills, for which the association has a weekly record of production, orders and shipments, exceeded the output for the week ending August 23 by 7.97 per cent. New business reported by those 228 identical mills for the five weeks from the week ending July 19 to August 23 shows that orders received during that period exceeded production by 4.63 per cent.

In the 14 weeks from May 24 to August 23, inventories declined 8.68 per cent. The continued decline in inventories and the steadily maintained favorable relationship of orders to production is gradually strengthening the sales position of the industry, according to the association.
