SEATTLE, Wash., Sept. 4 .- Continuing on the low production schedule they have followed since late in May, a group of 350 mills reporting to the West Coast Lumbermon's association for the week ending August 23 operated at 46.77 per cent of capacity. This figure compares with 47.21 per cent of capacity for the proceding week and with an average of 63 per cent of capacity from January 1 to June 1. These 350 mills have reduced output during the past thirteen weeks by 582,296,000 feet, which represents more than four weeks production for practically the entire lumber industry of Washington, Oregon and British Columbia at present operating W.
