McNARY SOLD ON RIVER WORK

Senator McNary is making every effort to get canalization started on the Willamette river. The senator is a go-getter and when he says it can be done then a good start has been made. As a member of the rivers and harbors and reclamation committees of the senate he has a wide knowledge of improvements that have been made in the Mississippi, Missouri, Ohio rivers and other rivers. The return for a dollar invested has been much less on these streams than will be the case of the Willamette river. Navigation and drainage of adjacent land are the big factors now. Later power development and irrigation may also result. It behooves us all to back up the senator.

WRONG BRAND OF CONSERVATION

It is the same brand of demagogues who want to conserve our water-power as wanted to conserve our timber a few years ago. They would let it rot on the stump—stand until useless and prevent new stands of timber growing on the land. This sort of conservation has done Oregon more harm than anything else. Many people believed it and turned to wood substitutes because they were told that the timber would soon be gone. Lumber consumption fell off and we had unemployment and bankruptcy in its wake.

Holding water-power undeveloped, which is what Julius Meier's policy is, means that energy is going to waste and industrial development is being retarded. We do not want conservation of water-power; we want utilization of water-power either by private or municipal ownership. Neither individuals or cities should be allowed to file on a power site and hold it for long undeveloped.

Federal licenses of water-power and Oregon law make it possible for municipalities to acquire developed power sites at cost if they cannot find suitable undeveloped ones. It is not a question of municipal vs. private ownership but political hooey vs. common sense.

DEMOCRACY GONE WILD

Thirteen proposed constitutional amendments will be before the people at the November election. Thirteen is an unlucky number so 'tis said. No doubt the supporters of most of these measures will agree that it is after the overburdened electorate gets through marking on election day. The initiative and referendum in Oregon is democracy gone wild. Nobody can vote intelligently on this conglomerated mess that covers everything from cigarette smoking to a complete change in state government.

Why should we raise the legislators pay if we are going to do all the work of making laws by ballot? We would be better off though if we paid them well and cut out trying to pass laws by ballot.

The state highway department is to cooperate with the federal government in keeping road work going to provide employment this winter. A good job to finish is the grading of the McKenzie highway from Doyle hill to Nimrod. If the winter is open like last this work could be carried on without delay. Completion of the McKenzie highway has drawn out now far too long. We should use every effort to get it completed without further delay.

THE INDIRECT PRIMARY CANDIDATE

The funniest part of Julius Meier's platform for governor is that he "stands for the direct primary and popular government." Yet Mr. Meier repudiated the action of the state committeemen when they met and nominated a candidate for governor. These committeemen were elected at the primary to represent the people in selecting a candidate. Mr. Meier called a crowd together that represented nobody and got them to nominate him. His idea of popular government is the rule of the mob. If all our candidates were nominated in this manner our government would be about as stable as that of Mexico or some of the South American countries. Consistency is not a plank in the independent platform, if it were there would be nothing for Mr. Meier to stand on. Mr. Meier was nominated by the INDIRECT primary.

INCOME TAX AGAIN

Again we are to vote on an income tax bill in November. This income tax proposition simply won't be whipped; it keeps bobbing up in one form or another. We've always been against the income tax bills as submitted principally because we could see in each double taxation, which is always an injustice. We have believed that an income tax that would take the place of the state levy on real and personal property would be wise and just and greatly relieve the overburdened. Will some tax expert tell us whether or not this is a practicable solution to our tax argument, and whether the rate would be exorbitant if we had to raise all state tax revenue this way.

WEST SPRINGFIELD TOO

A Willamette river development league is being organized. Springfield will have representation in it. Navigation of the river from Oregon City to Springfield will mean improvements that will result in solving the drainage problem in West Springfield. That district should join with Springfield in having a delegate at the next meeting in Albany. The government assumes the responsibility for flood conditions along all navigable streams.

If some scientist will figure out how to make tractor fuel out of some of the farm crops then real farm relief will be in sight. Horses and mules worked on what was raised on the farm but power farm machinery runs on the product of the oil companies. Consequently, in most cases, the farmer has no more left and often less after harvesting his crop with power machinery than with his horses.
