MISSION GROUP TO MAKE HANDKERCHIEFS FOR INDIANS IN MONTANA

Members of the missionary circle of the Springfield Baptist church held their regular meeting Tuesday evening at the home of Miss Gladys Chase in Chase Gardens at 7:30. Plans for the years' work were discussed and it was decided to make twenty-five large handkerchiefs of bright colored cloth for the Indians on the Crow reservation in Montana. The handkerchiefs are a yard square and are used by the Indians as wraps around their heads. This group recently gathered a box of clothing and sent it to the Indians of the Navajo reservation in Arizona.

Mrs. Elmo Chase had charge of the program and Mrs. D. C. Ogilvie was in charge of the business session.

DISCHARGE OF RIFLE FATAL TO YOUTH AT WENDLING ON SUNDAY

Elwood Nolen, 19, of Marcola, bled to death from a wound following the accidental discharge of a rifle Sunday. Nolen is reported to have been demonstrating something on a gasoline speeder at the Booth-Kelly camp number 2 above Wendling on Sunday when the thing started moving suddenly causing the rifle to fall from the speeder striking the ground in a manner that discharged the gun, striking Nolen in the leg. His brother, Edward, and his brother-in-law, Garwood Brockman, who were with him at the time of the accident, rushed him to Wendling, but he died from loss of blood before reaching the town.

Nolen is the son of Mr. and Mrs. L. E. Nolen of Marcola. He was employed by the Booth-Kelly Lumber company as a truck driver and had been working for this firm for eight months prior to the fatal accident. His parents had only recently moved to Marcola from Portland. He leaves his brother, two sisters, Mrs. Catherine Brockman of Wendling and Miss Roberta Nolen of Marcola.

The funeral services were held at the Branstetter chapel Tuesday afternoon at 2:00 o'clock. Rev. Bryant Wilson, pastor of the First Baptist church in Eugene officiated and interment was made in the new I. O. O. F. cemetery.
