NEW AIR MAIL LIST AT LOCAL POSTOFFICE

A revised list of postal fees plus air mail service charges for each half ounce or fraction has been received at the local postoffice by F. B. Hamlin, postmaster. The rate to Canada and Mexico is five cents for the first ounce or fraction and ten cents for each additional ounce or fraction. This is the same rate as is in effect in the United States. The list contains the names of three countries in various parts of South America which are the most expensive users of air mail. They are Argentina, Paraguay, and Uruguay.

It costs only five cents to send a letter weighing a half ounce or less by air mail to Cuba and the Bahamas.

POSTOFFICE SHOWS GAIN FIRST QUARTER

A gain of \$50 in receipts at the Springfield postoffice for the first quarter of this year over the first period last year was reported here this week by F. B. Hamlin, postmaster. This is especially interesting to local people in view of the fact that the office was successful in reaching the necessary volume of sales last year despite the business depression.

RESISTANT HOPS NOW BEING TESTED BY O. S. C.

Sixty young hop plants have just been received from England by Dr. E. N. Breesman, associate agronomist of the Oregon Experiment station, for use in an attempt to breed hops resistant to the downy mildew disease which threatened the hop industry of the Willamette valley last year. These plants have proved resistant to the same disease in England, and are said to be of a high yielding variety.
