PROMPT ACTION URGED AGAINST CATERPILLAR An infestation of tent caterpillars which may equal the proportions of the invasion of several years ago is showing up in Oregon this spring, according to reports received at the Oregon experiment station. These pests have been increasing annually, and this year are expected to reach the peak of their cycle.

IN ANSWER TO INQUIRIES FROM ORCHARDISTS, Dr. Con C. Mate, entomologist of the experiment station, says that prompt action will be necessary to protect foliage on fruit trees. He recommends spraying with 4 pounds of lead arsenate to 100 gallons of water while the caterpillars are young, adding 2 pounds of lime to the solution to prevent burning in the case of stone fruit trees. Lead or calcium arsenate dust is also effective, he says, as is a commercial pyrethrum liquid preparation put under a number of trade names.

OREGON HERDS HIGH IN DAIRY RECORDS Herds owned by 273 Oregon dairymen have been placed on the national herd honor roll for 1930, according to announcement made by Roger W. Morse, dairy specialist of the Oregon State college extension service.

This honor is accorded each year to dairymen whose herds have been on test in a herd improvement association during the year, and have produced an average of more than 300 pounds of butterfat per cow. They are also awarded diplomas. All of the 12 Oregon associations whose testing year ended January 1, are represented on this year's national honor roll. The Tillamook association leads with 50 honor members, whose herds averaged from 300 to 454 pounds of butterfat for the year.

The Umatilla association was next with 28 herds on the honor roll, followed by Willamette and Coquille valley, each with 27, Yamhill 24, Redmond 23, Union 21, Melrose No. 2 at Marshfield 19, Melrose No. 1 at Marshfield 15, Baker 14, Pine Eagle at Richland 13, and Hood River 12.

Oregon ranks fifth in the United States as to percentage of herds in dairy herd improvement associations, according to Morse. States ranking above Oregon in this respect, in order, are California, Arizona, New Jersey and New Hampshire.

Saturday will bring the annual campus luncheon at which time violation of an Oregon tradition against the wearing of neckties will lead many students to take an enforced plunge into the senior fountain.

The same evening students and their mothers will enjoy an annual banquet. This will be followed by the Junior prom at McArthur court.

FOREST SERVICE OFFERS NEW OREGON ROAD MAP A new road and information map of Oregon has just been issued by the U. S. Forest service. This 3-color map shows by appropriate symbols the paved, oiled and gravel roads of the state, also trunk highways, other auto and secondary roads. The fourteen national forests of Oregon are shown in light green, paved, oiled and gravel roads in red and other features in black. Some 20 of the principal recreation and resort areas of the national forest region are shown on the map with descriptions on the back of the folder, which carries 12 illustrations of Oregon forest scenes. This is the fifth edition of this map folder issued by the U. S. forest service since 1920.

Free copies are obtainable from the regional office in Portland, Oregon, and from any of the 14 forest supervisors' offices in the state. At the same time regional forester C. J. Buck announces a new edition of a map folder or "ranger map" for the Ochoco national forest in central Oregon. New features this year of these forest map folders are that they show the location of all improved forest camps, as well as airplane landing fields and game refuges. Copies of these forest folders may be had from the regional office, Portland, or from forest officers of the Ochoco national forest, Prineville, Oregon.

OREGON POTATO GROWERS WARNED OF FRAUDULENT SPUD TAGS Oregon potato growers who pay for certified seed potatoes this year are advised to read the tags carefully and be sure it is certified seed they are getting. Word that a company in Oregon is buying ordinary seed potatoes and selling them with a tag closely resembling the official certification tags issued by Oregon State college to growers of certified seed has just been received by E. R. Jackman, farm crops specialist of the Oregon extension service.

The limitation tags are the same size and color as the genuine ones, and are labeled "Seed Certificate" instead of "Certified Seed." The official tags are always attached with a lead seal. This is the first time imitation tags of this sort have appeared in Oregon according to Jackman, although they are common in some other states.
