FINAL DOLLAR DAY TRIPS START NEXT THURSDAY

Ten-Day Return Limit Offered on Tickets Sold for Memorial Day Vacations

Oregon's summer vacation travel, expected to increase this year will be given early impetus Thursday, Friday and Saturday, May 28, 29 and 30, with the re-establishment of a cent-a-mile roundtrip fares on Southern Pacific lines throughout the west it was announced here today by Carl Olson, agent for the railroad. Adding interest to the announcement from the viewpoint of the vacationist, Mr. Olson stated the Memorial Day sale will offer the added attraction of a twelve-day return limit. Tickets sold under the plan, he said, will be good until midnight of Monday, June 8. It will be the last "dollar day" event of the season.

In other respects the forthcoming sale will compare with the previous "dollar day" ventures originated and conducted by Southern Pacific during the past three months.

NEW FORAGE CROPS AT O. S. C. BEING SHOWN

Many Visitors at Experiment Station Get Information on Latest Developments

New and promising forage crops, irrigation experiments, summer dairy pastures, fruit, poultry and livestock projects are now being exhibited at the Oregon Experiment Station at Corvallis.

Canary grass, a valuable perennial pasture grass long recommended for low, wet ground, may soon take its place among the semi-dry land pasture grasses, according to Harry A. Schoth, federal agronomist at the State college. He has new selections being grown which are adapted to the higher, well-drained soils.

Meadow foxtail, a grass that looks like small timothy, is an other promising grass. It would be generally recommended now except that good seed is not available. The station is developing some non-shattering strains from which to start seed production in this country.

Crop rotation plus barnyard manure is the best and least expensive soil building treatment. C. V. Ruzek of the soils department tells the farmers on the fertility and irrigation plots. Much interest is being shown in the irrigation division where the college has been experimenting with a pumping system for more than 15 years.

The college has an irrigated ladino clover pasture which is now on its fourth season of pasturing. This clover is the best general irrigated pasture crop, but is not good unless there is irrigation or sub-irrigation. It will not stand even watering, however.

On the new small fruit farm the effects of irrigation on berry production and figures on the enormous increased yields brought by watering are demonstrated.

TOO MANY SPRINGFIELDS CAUSE SHIPMENT ERRORS

New York Shipping Clerks Confuse Oregon City with One by Same Name in Ohio

Carl Olson, local agent for the Southern Pacific railroad was wondering last week-end if Springfield was to have a J. C. Penney store located here or if one had been located here without his knowledge. The arrival of a large case of hats shipped from a New York manufacturer to the J. C. Penney store at Springfield, Oregon was the underlying reason.

Telegraphing the shippers, Mr. Olson found out Monday that the consignment was intended for Springfield, Ohio, but had been addressed wrong by a shipping clerk in the manufacturers plant. The merchandise was forwarded immediately.

OAK TREE LOOPERS ARE NOT FATAL TO TREES

The oak trees of the Willamette valley and other parts of western Oregon are not likely to be killed or severely injured by the oak looper, a caterpillar like insect which caused considerable alarm by practically defoliating a large number of these trees last year, according to Phillip C. Johnson, graduate student in entomology at State college who has just completed a two year study of the history and habits of this pest. Johnson found that previous infestations have occurred and usually run for three years, after which parasites gain control and cause their disappearance for a while.

Although no observations have been made so far this year, it is probable that the loopers will flourish again this season. Park or shade trees may be protected if desired by spraying with from 2 to 4 pounds of arsenate of lead to 100 gallons of water, says the entomology department.

They became the parents of 10 children and also raised a daughter by a former marriage of Mr. Ashley's. RURAL MAIL CARRIERS GATHER INFORMATION

Cards to be used in taking a livestock survey for the United States Department of Agriculture will be distributed by rural mail carriers in Lane county about June 1 according to an announcement received this week from the Department of Agriculture at Washington.

The survey is being undertaken to obtain accurate information to be used by the government in its attempt to bring about greater production of certain commodities and to urge lesser production of those things already available in greater quantities than needed.

Reports to be filled out will ask information about hogs, sheep, milk cows, milk production, and livestock.
