**LANE HEALTH AGENCIES URGE WAR ON FLIES**  
Action Now May Prevent Sickness and Death; Importance of Sanitation Stressed

Oregon's campaigns against flies and the elimination of the polluted sources of water supply are hailed by the Medical Denal headquarters of the Lane County Medical society and the Southern Willamette District Dental society as the two big agencies which have reduced the typhoid rate in Oregon to one of the lowest in the nation.

"The fly breeds in the garbage can and lives in filth and the people still wonder why it is that the common housefly has become such a menace to health of the babies of the nation," declares the Medical society's warning. "The fly plays around where the typhoid and other disease germs abound. On its feet and leg it carries the disease and filth which brings disease and suffering to mankind and its children.

The killing of a housefly today may prevent the death of a baby from typhoid this summer. The time to swat the fly is now when it is breeding its millions. The way to eliminate the fly is to destroy the infested places where it breeds.

"Scientists have calculated that the progeny of a single pair of flies, during the active season, is about 195,312,000,000,000. Now just suppose that some dutiful citizen wanted to better the health of his community by swatting the fly. If he had an indestructible swatter and an untrifling arm and killed an average of one fly every ten seconds for twenty-four hours a day, he would have accounted for only 8,640 flies. In just 6,192,303 years he would have finished off the last of the progeny. Of course, many other progenies would have lived and died before that if he had prevented that pair of flies from breeding he would have saved himself a lot of work and would have led a more useful life.

"Now is the time to rid the home and surroundings of flies and filth. Sunshine and health will take the place."

**FRUIT, NUT, PROSPECTS VARIED SAYS REPORT**  
Total acreage of fresh peas for shipments this year are reported to be substantially more than in 1930 when 73 carlots were sent from this state, according to L. R. Brethaupt, extension agronomist at Oregon State college.

He also reports varying prospects for the fruit and nut crops of the Pacific coast.

"The early reports from California indicate a smaller total output and smaller average size of prunes than in 1930," the report states. "A shortage of moisture especially in the southern prune producing districts is the cause of the reduction."

The condition of the California pear crop on May 1 is reported 6 points under a year ago, with poor prospects in the southern sections. Much depends upon growing conditions during the rest of the season. Some damage has been reported to the pear crop in Oregon and Washington, but prospects are still quite favorable.

The California walnut crop is starting the season in fair condition, but no dependable estimate of production can be made at this time. An increased output of cherries is estimated from California, but damage has been reported from several Pacific northwest cherry districts, the report says.

**PASTURE SPRINKLERS GET TRIAL IN BENTON**  
Pasture irrigation through the use of sprinklers will be tried out in Benton county this summer by Frank Hall and Curtis Martin of Fairplay community in cooperation with the agricultural engineer of the Oregon experiment state and C. R. Briggs, county agent. Systems of this kind have been found successful in orchards of Yakima valley and parts of California. As they put water on the ground

than other irrigation systems, it is believed that they would be useful in the Willamette valley where water for irrigation is limited.

Of course, many other progenies would have lived and died before that if he had prevented that pair of flies from breeding he would have saved himself a lot of work and would have led a more useful life.

"Now is the time to rid the home and surroundings of flies and filth. Sunshine and health will take the place."

**FRUIT, NUT, PROSPECTS VARIED SAYS REPORT**  
Total acreage of fresh peas for shipments this year are reported to be substantially more than in 1930 when 73 carlots were sent from this state, according to L. R. Brethaupt, extension agronomist at Oregon State college.

He also reports varying prospects for the fruit and nut crops of the Pacific coast.

"The early reports from California indicate a smaller total output and smaller average size of prunes than in 1930," the report states. "A shortage of moisture especially in the southern prune producing districts is the cause of the reduction."

The condition of the California pear crop on May 1 is reported 6 points under a year ago, with poor prospects in the southern sections. Much depends upon growing conditions during the rest of the season. Some damage has been reported to the pear crop in Oregon and Washington, but prospects are still quite favorable.

The California walnut crop is starting the season in fair condition, but no dependable estimate of production can be made at this time. An increased output of cherries is estimated from California, but damage has been reported from several Pacific northwest cherry districts, the report says.

**PASTURE SPRINKLERS GET TRIAL IN BENTON**  
Pasture irrigation through the use of sprinklers will be tried out in Benton county this summer by Frank Hall and Curtis Martin of Fairplay community in cooperation with the agricultural engineer of the Oregon experiment state and C. R. Briggs, county agent. Systems of this kind have been found successful in orchards of Yakima valley and parts of California. As they put water on the ground

than other irrigation systems, it is believed that they would be useful in the Willamette valley where water for irrigation is limited.

**EIGHTH GRADE EXAMINATION**
