If the tubers have sprouted a little however, it is best to treat lightly or not at all. Hyslop believes, Coating the cut seed with landplaster is essential to prevent rotting, especially where a scant moisture supply slows up germination.

Hyselop also emphasizes the wis seed for certification in one field helath.
