HOW TO PREVENT A CASE OF POISON OAK TOLD BY MEDICAL MEN

EUGENE, Ore., July 28—The season of poison oak, one of the commonest and worst of nature's abounding plant life, is now confronting Oregon vacationers, and demanding recognition as a cause of distressing poisoning leading to great discomfort and sometimes actual danger. This forms the subject treated this week by the Headquarters committee of the Lane County Medical society and the Southern Willamette District Dental society. "Poison Oak or poison ivy is easily mistaken for other similar plants but have distinctive characteristics, and the inexperienced person should learn to recognize it," declares the bulletin issued today. "In some climates it assumes the form of a low, erect plant, whose rootlets trail underground, and sometimes takes the nature of a vine, running over stones of having the tendency to climb the trunks of trees. In this form, it is popularly termed "poison ivy." In Oregon the plant usually grows as a shrub, and is called poison oak, but it sometimes entwines itself around trees. It is sometimes mistaken for Oregon grape, but grape has five leaves, while ivy or oak has but three, two of which are opposite and short stalked while the third or terminal leaflet is long stalked."

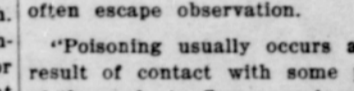
