Army officers, with the exception of the Engineer Corps which is one hundred per cent busy on reclamation and similar projects, are also dismayed by the order.

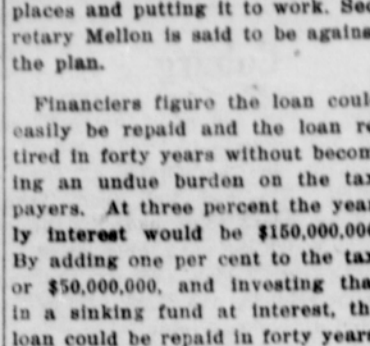
