COUNTY BRIDGE BURNED

Forest Fire Burning Over Big Area in Cogswell Hill, Cedar Flat Districts

Two large hop drying sheds located just south of Willamette Heights were completely destroyed by fire Wednesday afternoon at 3 o'clock and a score or more homes and other buildings were endangered in one of the most spectacular brush fires seen in this vicinity for several years.

The blaze was first noticed by Mrs. Nels Fisher when she saw a small area burning alongside of their home. She immediately called Morning and Evening Service her husband to get the hose out, and before anything could be done the flames had been carried all over the area between the south Second street road and the Willamette
