RED CROSS ASKS GARDEN PLANTING

Greater Production of Vegetables Expected to Reduce Cost of Poor Relief

Taking up a suggestion handed on by the Cottage Grove relief council, officers and members of the Lane County Red Cross at their annual meeting held at the Osburn hotel last week decided to launch a county-wide Garden Plot movement as an aid to lessening the need for relief work during the next year.

The plan as it is being carried out by the Cottage Grove people starts with the compilation among all those now getting relief of a questionnaire showing a complete record of the amount of ground now available for garden purposes, the ability of the person to furnish the necessary seeds and jars for canning purposes.

Those who do not return the questionnaire and those in need but who neglect to raise a garden this coming summer will be considered as having put themselves beyond the need of help from the relief council of the Grove city.

An extensive campaign to have the needy people of the county produce most of their own food for the next year will be launched in all parts of the county immediately. A campaign will be started to secure garden plots for those who have none, to furnish seed for those who cannot buy them, and later to carry on instruction work in methods of canning and preserving surplus foods for winter use.

No organization has taken up this work in this city, but it is expected that it will be started soon. Mrs. M. B. Huntly, Mrs. A. B. Van Valzah, and W. P. Tyson, all of Springfield, are members of the executive committee of the county Red Cross unit.
