**CONTROL OF MALARIA DISCUSSED BY KERRON**

Probable steps which will be taken in an effort to control and eventually wipe out malaria in Lane, Linn and Benton counties were outlined Monday morning by Dr. Seth Kerron, Lane county health officer in a radio address broadcast over station KORE under the auspices of the Lane county Medical and Dental association.

Present plans call for united effort of the three counties in a campaign to dust all breeding places with Paris Green dust. This would have to be done by airplane three or more times during the summer, and one person would have to be employed to investigate the condition of the various bodies of water frequently during the summer to determine when large numbers are breeding.

There have been several cases of malaria in northern Lane county during the past few summers, and one case reported this week.

The use of screens on all windows was recommended by the health officer.
