Details of the organization are not completed, but the outline of the plan is something like this. For every dollar's worth of produce deposited with the Exchange a receipt will be given for a dollar, less All kinds of lumber, vegetables, fruit, wood, or any other useful produce or labor will be accepted here for exchange. The banking principle will be used to credit deposits or make payments against

Perishable fruits will be canned preserved, made into jam, etc, and put into containers. Some fruits will be sun dried. The small commission charged will be for the expense of operating the exchange on a non-profit basis.

Depositors or shareholder meet ings will be held regularly to disate rules to operate under. The purpose of this exchange is to gain the greatest possible good for ourselves and the community at large by utilizing produce that cannot be sold or is surplus in the commun-

Receipts given for produce or products delivered at the Exchange will be honored for other items which the holder may be in need of, or for labor, says Mr. Ware. A man having a surplus of one commodity may hire some person through the exchange to help him.
