Cherries are ripe!

Dried cherries are delicious and can be substituted for raisins in puddings, pies, cakes and salads. Dry cherries unpitted by washing the pitting them on a wire screen in the oven or over artificial heat.

Cherry Olives

Fill a quart jar with large sweet cherries, leaving the stems on and packing the fruit as closely as possible. Mix 1 tablespoon of salt and cup of cold vinegar, and pour the mixture into the jar of cherries.

Cherry Cocktail

1 pound cherries; 1/2 cup chopped walnuts; 3 teaspoons lemon juice; 6 tablespoons strawberry juice; 6 tablespoons powdered sugar.

Cherry Relish

Remove pits from cherries. Drain cherries and cover with vinegar solution made in proportion of 3/4 cup vinegar to 1 quart water. Let stand for 6 hours, drain cherries, measure them and add an equal measure of sugar. Let cherries stand over night. Seal.

SPRAY FOR VEGETABLES GIVEN BY COUNTY AGENT

Larvae of diamond black moth are doing great damage to cabbage, kale, cauliflower, turnip, and similar plants in all parts of Lane county at this time, according to O. S. Fletcher, county agent. These pests can be controlled by spraying the plants that are being destroyed with a lead arsenate spray made according to the following formula: One ounce (40 level teaspoons) of lead arsenate to one gallon of water.
