IRRIGATED LAND TO BE VIEWED

Benefits of Extra Water to Be Seen on Two-Day Willamette Valley Trip

How irrigation is serving in western Oregon to cut down production costs of dairy and other products and frequently raise quality as well, will be viewed by those who make the third annual Willamette Valley irrigation tour scheduled for August 18 and 19. Plans are now completed for this trip which is sponsored jointly by the irrigation committee of the Oregon reclamation congress and the Oregon State college extension service.

The tour is open to farmers, business men, bankers or any others interested in this new phase of agricultural development in this section. The trip will start at Portland and end at Eugene, with everyone free to join at any point where most convenient and drop out whenever necessary, says Arthur King, extension soils specialist, who will be in charge.

Visit Lane County August 19 - Those leaving from Portland will start Thursday morning at 8:30 o'clock from Broadway and Stark streets, going at once to Hillsboro to join the Washington county party under County Agent Cyrus. After visiting two or three places between there and the west end of the county, the party will go to McMinville where the chamber of Commerce is preparing another all-irrigated-products dinner.

County Agent White will head the party for some visits to successful irrigation projects in that county, including the new community gravity system that extends across the line from Polk county into Yamhill near Sheridan.

RADIO KOAC ANNOUNCES HOMEMAKER PROGRAM

A "Homemakers Thrift Hour" is the latest feature arranged particularly for housewives, which has already been housed over the state college radio station, KOAC. This is a daily feature given from 2 to 3 o'clock except Saturday when it is given from 9:30 to 10:30 o'clock in the forenoon.

This hour is being conducted by Mrs. Mary Little Thomas, graduate of the college and former home demonstration agent in California, now on the staff part time and doing graduate work in home economics at Oregon State. She was one of the first to broadcast home economics material over the college station before going to California.

Methods of food preservation such as canning, drying, salting, curing, storage and jam and jelly making will be included in the scope of the material to be given. She will also discuss planning and preparation of low cost meals, short cuts in house work, planting and care of fall gardens, and field reports of emergency relief work being carried on in the state.

This program, in fact, is closely allied with the work of the food committee of the state relief council and is designed to further the work of the committee, though it is broad enough in scope to interest all homemakers, believe those in charge.

Other members of the college staff will appear from time to time on this hour under Mrs. Thomas' direction. The topics will be kept timely as the season advances.

MANY CAMPING PEOPLE CARELESS WITH FIRES

Various Offenses Against Safety of National Forests Cited by Regional Officer

Four prospectors and four school teachers in the Siskiyou national forest have been arrested and fined for violation of federal or state fire laws, is the report just received by regional forester C. J. Buck.

Joseph Jensen, prospector, Klamath Falls, became lost from his party in Del Norte county, Calif., built a signal fire and left it unextinguished. The fire spread, covering 3,000 acres, with damages and suppression costs of 96,000. Jensen was arrested and taken to Crescent City where he was fined \$10.00.

Lee Gerber, prospector, Illabe, Oregon, threw away a cigarette which wasn't out. He was arrested, tried at Agness, Oregon, and fined.

William Bryant, prospector, Port Orford, Oregon, burned brush in the closed season without a permit. His fire got away and cost \$3300 to put out. Bryant was arrested, tried at Myrtle Point, Oregon, and fined \$25 and costs.

Robert H. Smith, prospector, Gold Beach, Oregon, left his camp fire unextinguished and unattended while he looked for gold. He was arrested, taken to Mule Creek and fined \$25.

Buel Beckham, Don Beckham, Paul Luy and Francis Neff, teachers, all of Bandon, Oregon, spent their vacation near Illabe on the Rogue River but apparently did not know enough to put out their campfire. The forest rangers were away at the time. Local settlers requested the teachers to put out their campfires and later reported

the violation to the rangers. Buel Beckham took the blame, was tried at Port Orford and fined \$13. From the Cascade forest, Oregon, comes a report of two men who left their campfire not put out.
