BREEDING FOR PRICE RAPPED

Continuation of Research Poultry Work Demanded by State Convention Session

Determination to fight if necessary for continuation of poultry's share in agricultural research was repeatedly expressed by the Oregon Poultrymen's association at the ninth annual poultrymen's convention at Oregon State college. The program consisted mostly of hearing results of recent experimental work carried on for the industry since the last meeting two years ago.

Most former officers were re-elected, Fred Cockrell of Milwaukie remaining as president; J. R. Russell, Corvallis, as vice president; and Lloyd Lee of Salem as one of the directors. F. L. Knowlton of the experiment station staff succeeds H. E. Cosby, extension specialist, as secretary-treasurer, and G. M. Leslie, Tigard, is a new director. Close to 300 attended the meeting.

The association voted to maintain a strong legislative committee to present the needs of the industry in maintaining experimental work, particularly with poultry diseases, saying this and related investigations are vital to the Oregon poultrymen.

Seek Dog Loss Aid

A change in the present sheep-killing dog law was advanced which would include poultry under its benefits. Large losses are now sustained at times from stray dogs, it was said.

Losses from theft, on the other hand, have been reduced to a minimum by the working of the "gasoline cowboy" law and the new state police system, President Cockrell reported. So much better has this situation become that the association voted to discontinue its affiliation with the private detective agency dealt with for several years. The old association "yellow tag plan" is being continued, however.

In a review of the present status of the industry in Oregon, H. E. Cosby declared that one of the most dangerous tendencies is that toward "chicks at chewing gum papers" where some hatcherymen are according to buyers' demands for cheap chicks by lowering breeding standards. This, said Cosby, will ruin the industry if persisted in.
