U. O. FOOTBALL STARTS FRIDAY

Webfoot Team Meets Pacific Eleven in Night Contest to Open 1932 Grid Season

University of Oregon, Eugene, Sept. 22—(Special)—University of Oregon will open its 1932 football schedule Friday night against Pacific university. The game will be played on Hayward field, under flood lights.

Callison, however, is going to be handicapped by the toughness of the schedule. Oregon, as no other team in the conference, plays three tough games in the first three weeks of the season. After the Pacific tilt Oregon takes on Santa Clara here October 1. Then comes Washington in their traditional battle at Portland October 8. The California Bruins meet the Webfoots, also in Portland, October 15, in the annual Shrine game.

Hughes Moved to Center
A wealth of material is available because Oregon has no experienced center. Callison has been forced to shift Bernie Hughes, veteran guard, to the pivot post. That means that the Ducks will have two new guards this fall, and on the showing of these guards will depend Oregon's chances in conference competition.

Aside from guards, a veteran is available for every position. That includes Captain Morgan and Nilsson at tackle; Bailey and Wishard at end; Bowerman at quarter; Mikulak at full, and Temple and Gee at half.

The game Friday evening may or may not be an easy one for the Oregon boys. They remember the scare which Monmouth and Willamette caused with a dazzling array of old discarded football tricks.

Reduced license fees for dogs in Lane county were asked of the county court last week-end at a meeting of the South Lane County Taxpayer's league at Cottage Grove. The following petition was prepared for submission to the county court.

"We the undersigned taxpayers of Lane county, do hereby request and petition by the authority of the law as stated in chapter 226, section 1, act 1931 of Oregon statutes: That one dollar be refunded to all persons who have paid the regular dog license for the year 1932, the refund to be one dollar for each dog on which license has been paid.

"We further petition the county court that the annual license shall be reduced the following amounts: Fifty cents for all male and spayed female dogs and one dollar for all male dogs. The same to take effect on January 1, 1932."

Members of the Tax League contend that a surplus of over \$2,000 has been paid into the general fund from the collection of dog taxes for several years and that there is something like \$4,000 there now. They claim that less than \$700 was required to settle claims for goats and sheep killed last year.
