

The illustration has been prepared by the Society for Electrical Development and gives the number of artificial lighting hours, per day, for each month in the year. You will notice that the average use of electric light in a residence in Decem-

ber is the heaviest of the year. In December the average use is nearly 7 hours a day, whereas, in June, the average is only 2.55 hours or 2 hours and 33 minutes.

In January, the daylight hours grow and the artificial lighting hours decrease. And this condition continues from month to month until we again reach the balmy days of June.
