
Inn the fall of 1932 she won the Chicago Mail Order bronze medal State Officers Coming April for being the reserve style show

#### Closed Waters In Lane Listed

Few Streams and Lakes Regulated in County for 1933 Season, Fewer Closed

Fishermen coming to Lane county this season for their vacations and those who live here will find very few lakes and streams within this county closed to them this summer according to the new official synopsis of the Oregon Fishing laws which have been received here by Wright and Sons, hardware and sporting goods dealers.

Many of the streams which were screen star, arrived in Hollywood; Many of the streams which were just in time to meet the situation of closed last year have been opened for limited seasons this year. Salt Creek from Gold Lake to Salt Creek falls, a distance of three miles, and Layng creek, tributary to Row river above its confluence with and including Herman creek, and all tributaries to that part of Layng creek are the only streams in the county which will be clased all sum-

Gold lake, Betty lake, Island lake, and Marylyn lake are open from May 27 to November 30 with a bag limit of 15 pounds and one fish and not to exceed 25 fish for any one day or 50 fish in any seven consecutive days.

Horse lake, Middle Horse lake, Lower Horse lake, and Hidden lake are open from May 15 to September 20 with the same bag limit. Maple creek and Fiddle creek will be open from April 15 to October 31 both dates inclusive.
