



POOLS FORMING FOR WEED KILLER

Orders Must Be in County Agent's Office Monday or Thursday Each Week

In order to assist Lane county property owners in their weed control work, O. S. Fletcher, Lane county agricultural agent, will again pool orders for sodium chlorate and atlatide at cost. Pools will be closed Monday and Thursday of each week. Chlorate orders on Monday should be ready for delivery on Wednesday, while supplies ordered on Thursday should arrive on Saturday. Prices will be quoted on request to interested parties.

Sodium chlorate comes in 100-pound drums only, while atlatide may be obtained in either 100-pound or 50-pound drums. Orders for less than one drum cannot be accepted by the county agent. Parties desiring less should arrange to form or with a neighbor.

Tests Prove Successful

That these weed killers are effective has been shown during a series of demonstrations and field trials conducted in Lane county during the past five years. In these it was found that chlorates are generally effective in controlling Canada thistles, wild morning glory, blackberry plants, poison oak, wild rose bushes, and other plants. Both sodium chlorate and the calcium chlorate weed killer known as atlatide were used. Four pounds of atlatide per square rod were required to give as good kills as three pounds of sodium chlorate.

Best kills of all kinds of plants were obtained where there was a heavy growth and where spraying outfits were used. No application of chlorates was 100 percent effective the first year, some follow-up work being required the second year. There have been many failures for which no cause is apparent.

There were a number of fires where sodium chlorate was used, showing the importance of using precautions to prevent fires.

Many to Cultivate for Weeds

Because of the scarcity of cash and the low cost of labor, most farmers will prefer to kill weeds by cultivation rather than with chlorates, says Mr. Fletcher.

A group of recommendations on the use of the weed killer sprays has been prepared by Mr. Fletcher and are available at this office in the Producers Public Market building in Eugene.
