DELEGATES TO VOTE WET

Debt Limitation Only Other Measure to Carry; Oleo, Sales Tax Heavy Losers

Two of Springfield's precinct's, one and three, remained in the dry column in the special election held Friday, but the total majorities for repeal of the federal dry act in the other two precincts absorbed the majorities and left the total vote on this, the major question up for consideration at the election, at 278 in favor of repeal and 234 op-

Precinct one cast a vote of 44 for and 57 against repeal, while the third precinct drys could muster only a majority of five, the vote being 68 yes, and 73 no.

The state repeal measure carried in all precincts but number one where the vote stood 50 yes and 52 no. The total vote for the repeal in the four precincts was 321 as compared with 249 against it.
