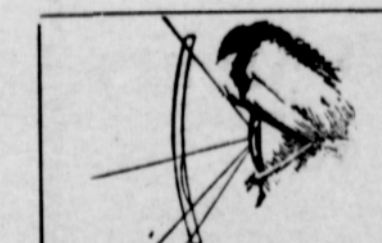

ANTI-DUMPING ACT NOW IS ENFORCED IN STATE

Greater Protection for Oregon Produce Growers Sought; Outside Competition to be Checked

The Produce Dealers and Peddlers act passed by the last session of the state legislature is now being enforced according to W. R. Upshaw, field representative for this district.

This bill is generally known as the "Anti-Dumping Act" and it licenses and regulates produce dealers, commission merchants, brokers, credit buyers, and peddlers.

The act has been enforceable since April 1, of this year, but due to an injunction suit filed by a group of Portland peddlers, the Department of Agriculture has withheld active enforcement pending court action. Judge Crawford has ruled the act to be valid in every respect and Department employees are now covering the state in an intensive enforcement program. In the Portland area, enforcement is now practically 100 percent and peddlers and dealers refusing to make application are now being taken into court.

The law is intended to prevent irresponsible peddling and dumping of huge quantities of out-of-state produce on our markets, and will tend to stabilize our produce industry, an industry in which 30,000 Oregon farmers are vitally interested, and one which has been all but wrecked by the tremendous increase in itinerate peddling of late years, says Mr. Upshaw.
