to be valid in every respect and Department employees are now overing the state in an intensive enforcement program. In the Portland area, enforcement is now practically 100 percent and peddlers and dealers refusing to make application are now being taken into

The law is intended to prevent irresponsible peddling and dumping of huge quantities of out-of-state produce on our markets, and will tend to stabilize our produce industry, an industry in which 30,000 Oregon farmers are vitally interested, and one which has been all but wrecked by the tremendous increase in itinerate peddling of late years, says Mr. Upshaw.
