Springfield high school track men made a very favorable showing in the Willamette Valley track and field meet at Salem Saturday when four students won a total of 12 1/2 points...

Malcolm Hanson continued his winning streak in the Willamette meet in which 12 teams were entered by taking eight of the Springfield points himself. He took first place a mile and was shoved into second in the half-mile by one of the Indians from Chemawa.

Hartman was next highest winning third in the half mile, and a tie for fourth place in the pole vault. Morris Stewart and Disque Smith finished fourth in the 100 yard dash and 220 low hurdles respectively.

Roseburg won the meet with 39 1/2 points with Cottage Grove trailing second with 24 1/2 points.

Only a few scattered points were gathered by the teams north of Lane county. Corvallis had 11, Oakland 5, Salem 3 1/2, Silverton and Stayton each three, and Hill Military Academy 2.

No track or field meet is planned for this week-end. The boys will rest in preparation for the district elimination meet to be held on Hayward field in Eugene on Saturday, May 12, one week preceding the state meet which is to be held at Corvallis this year on May 19.

Charles H. Powell, lifelong resident of Lane county, died at the Eugene hospital Sunday following a three-months illness.

Funeral services were held Wednesday at 2 o'clock from the Pooler-Gray-Bartholomew chapel in Eugene with Rev. Mr. Lindley, pastor of the Methodist church, officiating.

Mr. Powell was born in the upper McKenzie country on December 24, 1869, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Giles Powell, early county settlers.

On June 5, 1910 he was married to Miss Inez Oldren of Irving. He was a member of the United Brethren church in Eugene, and of the South Benton grange.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Inez Powell, two sisters, Mrs. J. B. Wilhelm of Grants Pass, and Mrs. H. O. Wimmer of Irving, and two brothers, George P. Powell of Irving, and Bruce P. Powell of Medford.

Every effort is now being made by the players to win their games with Eugene high, the first of the two games will be played in Eugene on Tuesday, May 8. Persons who have watched both teams in action predict that the Springfield boys will run away with this game also.

Want To Defeat Eugene Coaches, Buell and Wm. Davis, are not so sure, and are not leaving anything undone which might cause their players to lose this first Eugene game.

Following their 10-4 victory over Pleasant Hill there last Friday the Springfield team does not expect much trouble in taking the second game from that team here May 11, a week from Friday. The second game with Eugene to be played here on May 15 will close the season for the local team.

Okridge Game Unusual In the Pleasant Hill game the boys scored 11 hits and made 10 runs. Pleasant Hill batters were unable to garner more than 3 hits.

The Okridge game here Tuesday was the most unusual game of the season in that it went the full nine innings and was completed in less than one hour and a half.

Both team hit the ball, usually the first one pitched, and in most instances they were put out by an airtight support. Okridge made five hits and accounted for only three runs, while Springfield batters hit seven times to bring in five runs.
