applied locally. Registration of all truck owners is required under the code. Farmers and others who haul their own produce exclusively are not affected by the code.

All truck operators will soon receive forms on which they will have to list a schedule of minimum charges on which they propose to operate. These minima must be above the cost of operation, including NRA labor provisions, whether the truck is owner-driven or has an employed man at the wheel, according to the code authority.
