A combination using Ladino clover is ordinarily recommended for use only on soils of reasonably high fertility and which is either irriino clover is rather shallow rooted and hence requires these conditions for maximum growth. For practically all such conditions the following proportions are now recommended, says Harry Schoth, associate agronomist of the station: Ladino clover, 3 pounds; redtop, 4 pound 3; genuine English rye grass,
