The Frazier-Lemke amendment is in accord with the program of the Farm Credit Administration "since it attempts to prevent occasional selfish creditors from foreclosing an distressed farm debtors," according to W. I. Myers

It is believed, however, says Breithaupt, that perhaps only one farmer in several hundred will be unable to reach an agreement with his creditors, either directly or through the farm-debt adjustment committee or the county conciliation commissioner. Consequently. the number of cases which are like ly to be appealed from conciliation commissioner to the court under the provisions of the Frazier-Lemke amendment is not likely to be very great.

Refinancing Alds

The farm mortgage refinancing program of the Federal Land banks has been a powerful factor in cutting down the number of distressed farm debtors, according to Breithaupt who is secretary of the state farm-debt adjustment committee. During the past year the Farm Credit Administration loaned almost a billion dollars on farm mortgage security and made committments for \$700,000,000 more. The F. C.
