Should Take Advantage Of Free Service To Protect Many Private Wells

Although there are no known saving badges were awarded Satcases of typhoid fever in the city and no sudden development of the disease is expected, Dr. W. H. Pollard, city health officer, this urging them to have their water supply examined and tested for dangerous bacteria.

This is the time of the year when water supply becomes low, especially in many private wells and springs, and contamination of the source is most likely to take place, says Dr. Pollard. Those using city water do not need to have their water tested as it is tested frequently before being pumped into the city mains.
