



**TREE SURGERY METHODS EXPLAINED BY ZELLER**

**Sharp Tools, Cleanliness, Smooth Work and Protective Covering All Necessary**

In tree surgery, as in human surgery, there is a correct and an incorrect way to prepare a wound for successful and rapid healing, says Dr. S. M. Zeller, plant pathologist of the Oregon experiment station.

Sharp tools are necessary to do the job well, Dr. Zeller points out. After all diseased tissue has been cut away, healing is facilitated if the wound is shaped up to a point above and below. It is best to cut the edges of a wound at right angles to the surface of the bark, as slashing cuts do not heal readily, he says.

When it is necessary to remove a whole branch, make the cut as near the parent branch or trunk as possible. Stubs of branches can never heal, says Dr. Zeller. They die and become infection courts for wood-decaying fungi.

**Tree Center Dead Wood**  
When cavities and decayed parts are present, a simple method of tree surgery may prevent much greater expenditure of time and money later. The heart of a tree is dead wood and of no importance to the tree except for strength, Dr. Zeller explains. If it is decayed, it is therefore best to remove it, if the time and labor required are not too great. Where the cavity extends down the branch a considerable distance, it is necessary to provide a hole at the lower end for a drain, or if it is cup shaped the lower edge of the cup may be cut away to allow drainage.

After the wound is cleaned and shaped, a disinfectant is applied. A solution of corrosive sublimate, 1 part to 1000 parts of water, is effective. This material is a deadly poison and must be treated as such, Dr. Zeller warns. It must also be kept in glass or porcelain containers, as it attacks metals.

**Use Cleansing Solution**  
When the wound has been washed with this solution a wound dressing is applied, the sole object of which is to prevent infection by decay-producing organisms until the wound is healed by callus formation. As a wound dressing, Bordeaux paint, prepared by slowly stirring raw linseed oil into commercially prepared Bordeaux, comes the nearest to combining the necessary properties, Dr. Zeller says. Applied with care, this paint will remain for several years.

**TEACHERS WORK ON FALL PROGRAM**

Quincy, Roberts and Buell To Represent Local Schools In Planning Institute

Preliminary details for the annual Teacher Institute to be held for Lane county school teachers in Eugene on October 17 and 18 were announced this week by L. C. Moffitt, county superintendent.

The sessions will be held Thursday and Friday mornings and Thursday afternoon. The elementary principals banquet will be in charge of Roy Quincy, Lincoln school principal. A banquet for the men teachers, and one for Month-mouth graduates is planned.

The program is being arranged by teachers in the different grades and subjects this year with committees already appointed for this purpose. Representing Springfield schools on the program committee will be Opal Roberts, primary; and W. E. Buell, mathematics.

Subjects and program divisions to be arranged include primary, intermediate and upper grades, one room schools, art, health, library, English, social science, commercial, physical education, penmanship, girls league, dramatics, music, mathematics, four-H clubs and vocational guidance.

**POLICE START DRIVE FOR INTERSECTION VIOLATOR**

Through Traffic Must Give Way To Vehicles Properly Entering Fast Traffic Lanes

Violation of right-of-way laws is the offense on which police are concentrating their enforcement efforts during the second two-weeks part of the drive to reduce Oregon's mounting accident toll, which increased 20 per cent in injuries and 26 per cent in fatalities for the first eight months of this year, as compared to the same period in 1933.

Briefly, right-of-way laws of Oregon may be summed up as follows: Most important of all, since a large percentage of the more than 200 killed in accidents this year in Oregon have been pedestrians, is the rule that the pedestrian crossing a street or highway in a marked safety lane or an unmarked lane at the end of a block, has the right of way.

When two automobiles enter an intersection at the same time, the car on the left must yield to the car on the right, but a car entering the intersection first has the right of way. After making a full stop on entering a "through" street or highway, the motorist so entering has the right of way over vehicles on the "through" street, except those within the intersection or so close as to constitute an immediate hazard. The same rule applies to the driver who has properly signaled for a left turn. However, a car entering a public highway from a private roadway is required to yield the right of way to all cars approaching on the public road.

**PLANT WHOLE POTATO GET BETTER RESULTS**

The practice of planting whole tubers and removing all but three sprouts above ground is apparently going to give Hollis Auerway of Lebanon an increased yield of potatoes, reports Floyd C. Mullen, county agent. Mr. Auerway says he planted large potatoes due to the dry weather conditions, and too many sprouts appeared above the ground. He removed the excess sprouts from all but a small plot in the field. Where this was done the potato vines are several inches taller and the tubers considerably larger than those of the check plot.
