SPRINGFIELD VOTES COST COUNTY 23 CENTS

It cost Lane county an average of twenty-two and one-half cents for each vote which was cast in Springfield in the recent general election according to figures released by W. B. Dillard, county clerk. The sum included the cost of materials as well as election hall rent and salaries of workers. In Springfield the cost per precinct was as follows: First, 23 cents; second, 16 cents; third, 22 cents; and fourth 23 cents. Rent was paid the schools for polling places but not the city hall.

The average cost per vote in the county was 39 cents, or a total of \$5432.71 for the complete election. The lowest cost was in Eugene number 8 and 9 at 13 cents each, and the highest was in the Five Rivers precinct where the total vote was 15 and the expense per vote was \$2.51.
