Parents Should Study With Children To Avoid Tragedy In Later Part Of Life

University of Oregon, Eugene, Dec. 27-(Special)-The next goal of adult education in the United States should be a two-fold program of training of parents in relation to their own children, it was declared here by Dr. C. V. Boyer, pesident of the University of Oregon, in an interview. Dr. Boyer, long a strong advocate of adult education, has closely studied this work not only in this country but

abroad. The program Dr. Boyer has in mind includes: First, classes for parents in elementary school subschools, so that parents denied educational opportunities in their youth can keep up with their children, and second, classes that will actually instruct the parent in taking care of the child and aiding him in development in learning,

training and character. Keep Up With Children

"One of the tragedies of American life is that children go to grammar school, then high school and often on to college, and somewhere in the process far outstrip ance from all parts of the country, their parents in education," Dr. Boyer points out. "This often sets up a barriér between parent and ing and actual grief. If parents would attempt to keep up with the children, a common bond would be established and a great deal of pleasure and mutual benefit de-

rived from learning together." Courses to aid parents in rearing their children properly would not need to have such high sounding names as "psychology of adoloscence," or those similar, although courses in psychology should be included on the program, but could be simply "reading for the child," "choice is a profession," "home and chool discipline," "problems of the home," and "child growth," Dr.
