All Lane county farmers are urgently invited to attend the first annual meeting of the Willamette Production Credit association at

Salem, January 14. "The Willamette Production Credit Association is the farmer's own cooperative organization, making production loans to its stockholder-members on a business basis at actual cost," says J. M. Thorne, secretary. "It isn't a government agency and it doesn't loan government money. The federal govern-Mrs. H. H. Myers entertained at a ment, through the farm credit adwatch party Monday evening for ministration, helped provide the themselves to operate this machinery successfully."

A. B. Robertson, assistant treasurer of the Production Credit corporation of Spokane, will be present to answer questions regarding production credit and other divisions of the farm credit administration system.

The Production Credit corporation supplied a major portion of the original capital required to set up the association, and exercises general supervision over the 30 PGAs now serving farmers in every county of the four northwest

states. Loans have been available this year at 5 per cent-a record low ate. Future loan costs will depend, of course, upon the trend of the money market and how the associations conduct their business-how well they develop a profitable volume of loans, reduce their overread and avoid losses.

The associations discount the notes of their members through the Federal Intermediate Credit bank of Spokane, which uses them as backing for debentures offered to the investing public. As additional collateral, the associations pledge their capital stock (invested in government bonds) with the credit

The present standing of Intermediate Credit bank debentures is so high that investors have been eager to buy them at a yield of approximately 1 per cent. This standpermitted a 3 per cent margin for
