Use Of Money For Other Purposes To Precipitate Statewide Trouble

Diversion of monies from the state highway fund will bring immediate action by the Oregon Motor association toward reducing the gasoline tax until the motorist will be paying only the amount considered necessary for highways, E. B. McDaniel, president of the as sociation, declared yesterday.

"The motor association is against any diversion of fees, is opposed to any increased taxes on the motorist, is of the opinion that no additional burdens should be placed on the motorist until he has reduced his present debt load to a point where he can see his way clear.

Incur Large Debt "Motorists of Oregon have been most generous in tuilding and paying for a highway system outstanding among the highway systems of various states of the nation. The motorist has agreed to pay varying amounts to build and maintain highways and has assumed payment of a debt obligation which totaled more than \$40,000,000, and which has been reduced to approxi-

mately \$26,000,000." During 1935, Dr. McDaniels said, Oregon motorists will pay approximately \$13,000,000 for highways. Of this, \$10,000,000 will go to the state and \$3,000,000 to the federal government, to be returned in the form of federal aid for highways.
