A code of ten commandments designed to promote safety for the man in the automobile as well as the pedestrian, which points out various dangers attendant to wet and slippery pavements, and tells how they may be overcome has just been prepared by the Oregon State Motor association.

They are as follows: 1. Modify your speed for wet weather. Remember, any car will skid on a wet road.

2. Keep good tread on your tires to lessen the skidding hazard.

3. If, unavoidably, your wheels start to skid, take your foot from the throttle. Don't speed up or slam on the brakes, for that only defeats
