> ACCIDENTS STRIKE ONE OUT OF THREE

Chances Are Only Three to One That Automobile Will Kill You As Pedestrian

If you have three children the probability is that one of them during his lifetime will either be kill-ERNST BOEHOLT and KNUD ed or injured in an automobile accident.

This statement was made by Albert W. Whitney, vice-president of IN THE NAME OF THE STATE the National Safety council. It was based on national automobile accident figures wherein it was shown that 36,000 persons were killed and 954,000 injured during the 1934 calendar year.

If one of the children is killed, chances are nearly one out of two he will be struck by an automobile while walking. Chances are nearly one out of five he will be killed in a collision of two automobiles. Walking Along Highway Fatal

The greatest cause of pedestrian fatalities, records show, is cross ing a street between intersections

Other causes of pedestrian deaths, in order of importance were crossing at an intersection where there was no signal, 12.1 per cent; children playing in the street, 11.3 per cent; coming from behind parked cars, 9.4 per cent, and crossing at on intersection against the signal, 6.9 per cent.

Of the pedestrians killed, 8660 were between the ages of 15 and 64; 3240 were over 65 years old; 2.880 were between the ages of 5 and 14, and 1170 were under 4 years old.
