New Loans To Carry 41/2 Percent For Entire Period; Other Rates Staggered

AGENT FLETCHER TELLS OF PEPPERMINT CROP

Many Lane county farmers are planting peppermint roots this spring or thinking of doing so acof Frederick Gray, being Claim cording to County Agent O. S. No. 38 Notification No. 7258 in Fletcher. For the information of Township Eighteen (18) South these people and others that might be interested, the county agent has furnished us the following statements on the peppermint situation prepared by the Division of Crop and Livestock Estimates of the United States Department

of Agriculture. "The production of pepermint and spearmint oil during 1934 was 12 per cent less than the amount produced in 1933 although it was an increase of 4 per cent over the smallest production of record in 1932. The past season's peppermint production was only 40 per cent of the average production of 1929 and 1930. This information is based on the most recent survey of these mint crops in the important mint states of Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, Oregon and Washington.

"Grower reports indicate an acreage reduction of 10 per cent for 1934 compared with the year previous and 68 per cent less than the 57,060 acres harvested in 1930. Drought conditions in Indiana were responsible for considerable loss of new acreage and abandonment ated in Township 18, South of Range 1 West of the Willamette adverse growing conditions, poor yields and low prices, the Indiana mint acreage has been substantially decreased each year since 1929.
