OLD SOUTH RE-LIVED IN "NAUGHT MARIETTA"

French Settlement of Louisiana Background for Victor Herbert's Song Epic

LANE FIRE REPORT FOR PAST YEAR IS HIGH

Lane county stood in third place in the list of Oregon counties in number of fires reported during the year 1934, according to A. H. Averill, retiring State Fire Marshal. The county reported 179 fires within actual loss of \$199,462. Insurance in the amount of \$56,738 was carried on the property and losses of \$150,990 were paid, a percentage of loss to valuation of 18.07 per cent. Multnomah and Marion counties reported a larger list of fires.

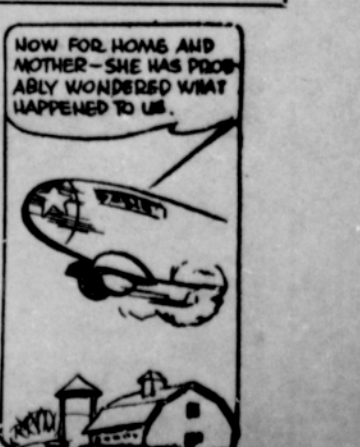
A ten pound boy was born to Mr. and Mrs. Peter Roberts at their home at Pleasant Hill Monday night, April 22.
