FARM CROPS WAIT ACTION BY A.A.A.

Marketing Agreements On Butter and Hops Being Studied At Washington

The vote being taken by the AAA among wheat growers during May will be the fourth such referendum that has been conducted since the adjustment law has been in force. Similar polls to obtain the views of farmers toward proposed adjustment programs were taken among corn-hog producers, tobacco growers and cotton farmers.

In some of these a number of questions were asked, but in the wheat referendum now under way in Oregon only a single question is to be voted on; namely, "Are you in favor of a wheat production adjustment program to follow the present one which expires with the 1935 crop year?"

The present surplus in the Pacific northwest, with what appears to be a heavy new crop coming on, is being much discussed by wheat growers in connection with the vote.

Disension on Butter

What has become of the proposed federal butter marketing agreement for the western states? In answer to this question the officials of the dairy section at Washington, D. C., report that all of the evidence obtained in the seven hearings is now assembled at Washington and being studied. As soon as all of the information has been considered the officials will come to a decision on the proposed program.

A majority of the cooperative producers representatives and other producers at the hearing favored some form of federal agreement, according to word from Washington. On the other hand, as a general rule the private and independent distributing systems submitted testimony largely against any butter marketing agreement at the present time.

Consumers' representatives who gave testimony at the hearings were particularly favorable to the proposed A, B, and C grading system such as is now in force in Oregon. Such labeling, they said, is a help toward intelligent buying and an incentive to better quality butter, which they believed would be reflected in greater use by consumers.

Hop Men to Vote

The hop industry of the three Pacific coast states now has be-

fore it the final draft of the proposed AAA marketing agreement for acceptance or rejection. If a substantial majority of the industry representing both producers and dealers sign the pact it will be put into effect by Secretary Wallace.

It includes provisions designed to limit tonnage, insure uniform grading and establish minimum prices. If put in force the agreement will be administered by a control committee consisting of seven producers, seven dealers and brewers, and a fifteenth member selected by these committee members.
