U. S. TAX ON GASOLINE MAY BE LIFTED JUNE 30

Evidence of increased interest among members of congress of both houses in the possibility of letting the federal gasoline tax lapse on its expiration date June 30, augurs well for the motorist, according to Ray Conway, manager of the Oregon State Motor association, who has received last-minute information from A. A. A. motor club headquarters in Washington, D. C.

"There apparently is growing interest not only in letting the federal gasoline tax lapse, but abolishing all special excise taxes on motor transport." As against this, the motor club manager stated, there is administration demand for continuation of all special excise taxes. Interest and improved sentiment on this issue among members of congress is due in a large measure to pleas "from back home," including many appeals from A. A. A. motor clubs.

"It is 'back home' that the issue will be determined," Mr. Conway said. "More than 250 organizations representing millions of taxpayers have adopted resolutions and appealed to individual congressmen to end this unpopular levy. Legislatures in 21 states have asked that it be allowed to lapse."

TOURIST GAIN IN OREGON ASSURED

California Exposition to Bring Heavy Stream of Traffic Northward This Year

An increase of 25 per cent in tourist travel in the Pacific Northwest is predicted for this year by the Oregon State Motor association. By far the largest share of this traffic will be over the Pacific highway says the association officials.

Tourist inquiries which this year arrived more than a month ahead of schedule, also assure the Pacific highway of its share of the season's business from residents of the northwest who plans to attend the California Pacific International exposition, which opens in San Diego, May 29.

All of those driving south are expected to use this route at least one way, and many of them already acquainted with the coast highway have indicated their intention of using the inland road both ways, the motor association pointed out.

Expect Heavy Northward Travel Visitors from all parts of the United States, planning to attend the exposition in Southern California, have requested information on Oregon, stating they intend to return to their homes via the northwest. Of these many will use the Pacific highway, it was declared.

Last year tourists spent approximately \$19,000,000 in Oregon, and the indicated 25 per cent increase is expected to raise the figure to more than \$23,000,000 this year. The volume of business will be greater than any since 1929 or 1930, the motor association believes.

Hotel, auto camp and resort owners along the Pacific highway and throughout the rest of the state are enthusiastic over the prospects, it was reported. Many are making alterations and adjustments in order to accommodate the business.

Autos Hurt Many Daily

During 1934 in Oregon, 15 persons were injured or killed each day, according to figures compiled by the Oregon State Motor association in connection with its "Let's Quit Killing" traffic safety campaign. More than 61 accidents occurred daily throughout the state. An average shows that one person was killed every 25 hours.

OPERATORS NEED LICENSE JUNE 30

All Present Drivers' License Expire; New Cards Good For Two Years

Every motor-vehicle operator in Oregon must have a new driver's license by June 30. Secretary of State Snell has promised an active campaign to eliminate unlicensed drivers from the streets and highways after that time.

All operators' permits, regardless of how recently they were issued, expire on June 30 under the new law. Even those carrying 1935 as the expiration date must renew them now. Renewals and new licenses are expected to total 425,000 each carrying a fee of \$1.

With a few exceptions, no person previously licensed in Oregon will be required to take an examination for a renewal. The new permit may be obtained by filling out accurately one of the renewal application blanks. Licenses will not be issued until after June 30, although applications are being accepted now.

Persons required to take the examination include applicants over the age of 70 years, or any person who has never been licensed as an operator in Oregon must make application directly to an authorized examiner of operators and chauffeurs. A new motor vehicle operator's manual will be issued.

Application for operators' and chauffeurs' permits may be made without having their signature acknowledged by a notary public. All new licenses will be effective for two years. They will carry June 30, 1937, as expiration date.
